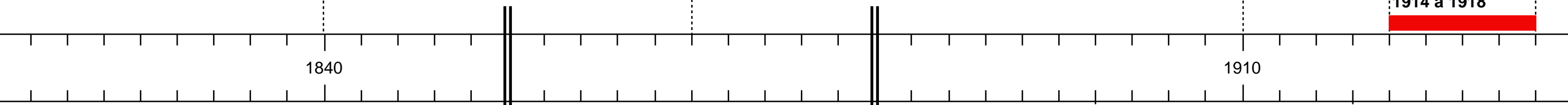

**1930**

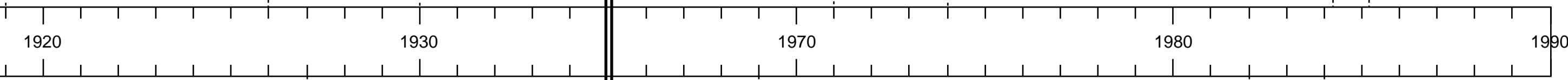


Miners' strike:
